Bluford, Robert Jr. *Living on the Borders of Eternity: The Story of Samuel Davies and the Struggle for Religious Toleration in Colonial Virginia*, pub. Historic Polegreen Press, 2004. (A fictionalized account of Davies' life and ministry. The author claims "...there is a core of historical truth." Mr. Bluford has been the driving force behind the historical site.)

Brainerd, David, *The Life of David Brainerd*, pub. Baker Book House, 1978 paperback edition. (Jonathan Edwards compiled this from Brainerd's diaries. A devotional classic)

Bridenbaugh, Carl, *Mitre and Sceptre: Transatlantic Faiths, Ideas, Personalities and Politics 1689 – 1775*, pub. Oxford University Press, 1962. (Classic study of the inter-action of religion and government between the colonies and the English motherland following the Act of Toleration in 1689)

Davies, Samuel, *Sermons on Important Subjects*, pub. Boston by Lincoln and Edmands. 1810. (This is a rare book in my possession. Davies sermons are available in a variety of printings and editions. I have compiled a spreadsheet cataloguing the 83 sermons and various editions. The sermons are available via the internet in pdf format.)

Edwards, Jonathan, *The Religious Affections*, pub. Banner of Truth, 1994 printing. Edward's classic in a nice size print and paperback. Also available in *The Works of Jonathan Edwards*.

Includes: *The Religious Affections*, *The Freedom of the Will*, *Dissertation on the End for Which God Created the World*, *A Dissertation on the Nature of True Virtue*, *The Great Christian Doctrine of Original Sin Defended*, *Narrative of Surprising Conversions*, *Thoughts on the Revival of Religion in New England* and other works, paper, and letters.

(This volume includes *A Narrative of Surprising Conversions* (Better known as *A Faithful Narrative...*), *The Distinguishing Marks of a Work of the Spirit of God*, and *An Account of the Revival of Religion in Northampton 1740-1742*.)

Fortson, S. Donald, *Colonial Presbyterianism: Old Faith in a New Land*, pub. Pickwick Publications, 2007. (Ten essays by conservative, reformed scholars including David Calhoun, Sam Logan, D.G. Hart and others covering the colonial period mainly through key people through Witherspoon.)

Heimert, Alan and Perry Miller, *The Great Awakening*, pub. Bobbs Merrill, 1967. (A collection of 645 pages from those who experienced the Great Awakening.) Lovelace, Richard E., *Dynamics of Spiritual Life: An Evangelical Theology of Renewal*, pub. InterVarsity Press, 1979. An excellent and well - researched overview of revivals and spiritual life from a conservative scholar of reformed conviction. Lovelace taught for many years at Gordon Conwell Theological Seminary.

Noll, Mark A., *The Rise of Evangelicalism: The Age of Edwards, Whitefield and the Wesleys*, pub. InterVarsity Press, 2003. (Noll teaches at Notre Dame with George Marsden. A good overview on both sides of the Atlantic.)

Noll, Mark A., Nathan O. Hatch and George M. Marsden, *The Search for Christian America*, pub. Helmers and Howard, 1989. A critique of the view that America was founded as a Christian nation from 3 scholars with evangelical to reformed convictions.

Old, Hughes Oliphant. *The Reading and Preaching of the Scriptures in the Worship of the Christian Church – Volume 5, Moderatism, Pietism and Awakening*, pub. Eerdmans 2004. (The relevant of Old's 6 volume work. Old reviews each preacher with good samples of his sermons and an analysis.)

Pilcher, George William, *Samuel Davies: Apostle of Dissent in Colonial Virginia*, pub. University of Tennessee Press, 1971 The main scholarly biography of Davies.
